Put in 	All packaging made of paper and cardboard, but also non-packaging paper and cardboard, e.g. newspapers, magazines, brochures, catalogues, books, notebooks, envelopes, folders, letter and writing paper, clean household paper, cardboard boxes (folded)	Put in 	All glass packaging, separated by white and coloured glass, e.g. bottles and jars for food, beverages, cosmetics, medicine	Put in 	All packaging made of plastics and composites, textile materials, ceramics, polystyrene, wood and bio-based materials, e.g.: bottles, yoghurt cups, films, bags, vacuum packaging, deep-freeze packaging, beverage cartons, blister packaging, disposable dishes	Put in 	Wearable and clean clothing, undamaged bags and belts, table cloths, bed linen, curtains, wearable shoes (tied together in pairs)	Put in 	vegetable scraps, fruit scraps, dry food, solid leftovers, eggshells, cut flowers, potted plants, coffee and tea grounds with paper filter, grass cuttings, leaves and branches	Put in 	ashes (cold), flower pots, brushes, sanitary towels, plastic and metal buckets, mirrors, dishes, window panes, light bulbs, sweepings, small animal droppings, cat litter, small metal parts, tools, bones, leather, soiled paper, toys, vacuum cleaner bags, wallpaper, diapers, torn clothing and shoes, dirty, wet textiles, cleaning rags, tailoring scraps		
Don't put in 	plastic-coated paper, soiled paper, beverage cartons, photos, wallpaper	Don't put in 	light bulbs, fluorescent tubes, energy-saving lamps, glass-ceramic stovetops, mirrors, window panes, crystalline glass, glassware, crockery, porcelain, vases, windshields	Don't put in 	Plastic products e.g.: toys, flooring, tubes, flower pots, household articles	Don't put in 	tools, wires, nails, bicycle parts, car body and motor parts, metal household articles, laundry racks	Don't put in 	Torn clothing, dirty, wet textiles, ski boots, ice skates, skates, rubber boots, cleaning rags and tailoring scraps, carpets, toys, soft toys	Don't put in 	plastic bags, bones, vacuum cleaner bags, diapers, ashes, cat litter and small animal droppings, liquid leftovers such as soups, sauces, oils, marinades	Don't put in 	bio-waste, construction waste, batteries, electrical appliances, energy-saving lamps, fluorescent tubes, problematic substances, disposable dishes, packaging materials, useable used textiles

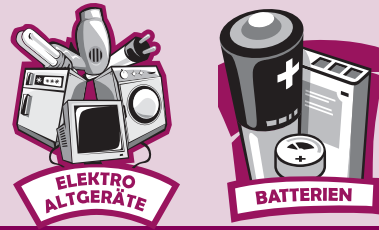


PROBLEMATIC SUBSTANCES

This is hazardous waste usually generated in a household. Examples are: engine oil, lubricants, paints, adhesives, poisons, solvents, gas cylinders, fire extinguishers, medicines, chemicals

Glow-discharge lamps and batteries can also be dropped off at the collection site for problematic substances

Old cooking fats and oils such as lard, oils from pickled or fried foods are not problematic substances. They should, however, be dropped off separately.



ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES BATTERIES

Large Electrical Appliances such as washing machines, dryers, electronic cookers, dish washers

Small Electrical Appliances such as coffee machines, mixers, cameras, DVD players, PCs and peripherals, mobile phones, CD players

Cooling units such as air conditioners, refrigerators, deep-freezers

Screens such as TVs, laptops, computer screens, monitors

Glow-discharge lamps such as energy-saving lamps, fluorescent tubes

Batteries such as appliance batteries, coin cells, rechargeable batteries

Drop-off free of charge
Retailer with sales area of more than 150 m², only on purchase of new equivalent device, batteries in all cases!



BULK REFUSE

is any waste which due to its size or weight cannot be collected in the residual waste container, such as: furniture, bicycles, carpets, mattresses, laundry racks, sinks



PLANT CUTTINGS

such as tree, hedge, shrub and grass cuttings
